All applications are scored, based on the scoring criteria set by the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board.

### Youth Agricultural Incentive Program (YAIP)

Many of you are familiar with the County Ag Investment Program (CAIP) that runs annually here in Harrison County to help farmers diversify their operations. This year our Ad Development Board has decided to also fund the Youth Agricultural Incentive Program (YAIP) to help youth that are interested in agriculture expand or start their project. This program is open to any Harrison County youth that is 9 years of age to a high school senior.

YAIP is a 50/50 cost-share based program that can reimburse up to \$1,000 per youth for their project. Project can include the following: Agricultural Diversification, Animal Production, Forage Improvement, Showmanship, Supervised Agriculture Experience, or Country Ham Projects.

The application period for YAIP will run from 8:00am on July 5, 2023 to 4:30 pm on July 25, 2023. Applications can be picked up at the Harrison County Extension Office at 668 New Lair Road in Cynthiana. Hours are Monday through Friday 8:00am to 4:30 pm.

## Start Monitoring for Garden Pests Today Whether it's slugs, squash vine borer, or

Colorado potato beetle, home gardeners know that every year some creepy crawly is looking for a free meal in their vegetable patch. Unfortunately, pest management in home gardens often relies on a reactive, sprayoriented approach to these pests rather than taking a more engaged attitude that helps to prevent problems. You can change that through integrated pest management and focusing on monitoring for pests before they become a true issue.

Integrated pest management, also known as IPM, is a philosophy of pest management that intends to use all the available tools at our disposal to help suppress pest populations. This can look different depending on the pest being managed and the situation in which the pest is an issue. In the home garden, some simple pest management tools can include cultural methods such as fall garden sanitation, which removes overwintering habitat for pests. Physical methods, such as floating row covers, which exclude pests from plants, and insecticidal control, such as spraying Bt when dealing with caterpillars.

IPM is not an organic approach necessarily; IPM can include synthetic insecticides when they are the appropriate method of suppression. *Source: Jonathan Larson, UK Entomology Specialist*

# Cucumber, Corn, and Bean Salsa

- 2-3 large cucumbers
- 2 tomatoes
- 1 yellow bell pepper
- 1 small red onion
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro
- 1/2 cup black beans

Wash all vegetables. Finely chop cucumbers, tomatoes, pepper, and onion. Combine in a large mixing bowl with chopped cilantro. Drain and rinse beans and add to chopped vegetables. Add corn. If using canned corn instead of fresh, drain off liquid prior to adding to vegetables.

In a small bowl, mix together ranch

% cup cider vinegar

2 tablespoons sugar, optional
