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## **County Ag Investment Program (CAIP) Changes for 2024**

I have already been getting a lot of CAIP cost share related questions so I wanted to touch on a few changes that are taking place for 2024 before the applications are even available so that you are aware. The CAIP program is no longer solely a 75/25 cost-share as it has been for the past several years. It is now on a tier system of either 75%, 50%, or 25% cost-share depending on what investment area project you choose to do. You can scroll about halfway down the page and you will find the CAIP section that looks like the image below. Here you can click on each of the green investment areas to see exactly what qualifies along with the reimbursement tier that item is in.

Please do not bombard the office with questions regarding CAIP at this time! There will be an informational meeting once we get closer to the application period in late June/ early July, but since I have been receiving so many questions I wanted to put this out there for those interested to look at in the meantime. Another change is that <u>EVERY</u> applicant must turn in a copy of their valid KY Driver's License along with a utili-

ty bill that matches the name and address on the license to have a complete and valid application.

Another change to note is that Ag Lime is no longer a reimbursable cost-share item for the CAIP program, so if you were planning to purchase lime for cost-share you will need to think about another project.
As always each application must have a valid up to date Ag Water Quality plan on file as well so if you have not completed that or haven't updated yours in a few years then it would be good to go ahead and do so before the application period to get ahead of the game. If you need a copy of the AWQP to fill out please stop

by our office or the Soil Conservation Office for a copy.

Again, there will be an in-person informational meeting that will be held in late June/ early July so don't be too overwhelmed by this information, I just wanted to go ahead and get some of the changes out to everyone to read over before I am out for maternity leave.

# Broccoli Brunch Casserole

Cooperative Extension Service

Nonstick cooking spray 8 ounces ground turkey sausage 3 1/2 cups broccoli florets, chopped 1 1/2 cups shredded, part skim mozzarella cheese, divided
8 eggs
1 cup part skim ricotta cheese
1/4 cup skim milk 1 teaspoon ground black pepper 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 Roma (Plum) tomato, thinly sliced

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Spray a 9-by-13-inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray. Place a medium-sized skillet over medium heat. Sauté sausage until evenly brown, drain well, crumble, and cool slightly. In a medium bowl, mix cooked sausage, broccoli, and a ½-cup of mozzarella. In a separate bowl, whisk eggs until frothy and then combine with a ½-cup of mozzarella, ricotta cheese, milk, pepper, and salt. Spoon the sausage mixture into the prepared baking dish. Spread the egg mixture over the sausage mixture. Sprinkle with the remaining mozzarella, and **arrange** the tomato slices on top. **Cover** with foil, and **bake** 30 minutes. **Uncover**, and **bake** for an additional 15 minutes. Let **stand** for 10 minutes before serving.

Yield: 8 slices

#### Nutritional Analysis:

260 calories, 16g total fat, 7g saturated fat, 0mg cholesterol, 550mg sodium, 7g total carbohydrate, 1g fiber, 1g total sugars, 0g added sugars, 20g protein, 6% DV vitamin D, 25% DV calcium, 10% DV iron, 6% DV potassium.

# Gateway and Barn Access Erosion Control Program

The purpose of this program is to help Harrison County landowners with the necessary means to repair gateways/barn entrances to reduce degradation, soil erosion and pollution.

Eligibility	Requirements         - Application must be approved <u>before</u> starting project         - Project <u>must be completed within 90 days after approval</u> - Must use Non-woven filter fabric		
- 50/50 Cost Share Rate not to exceed \$500.00 (Reimbursed 50% of expenses, up to \$500)			
- One application per FSA farm number, Landowner,			
and/or Household	- Must install at least 6 inches of stone to secure fabric		
- Must have an active Ag Water Quality Plan	- Ensure full coverage of filter fabric by the rock		
- Only gateways and barn access points eligible.	- Notify district when project is completed for a checkout		
Does NOT cover driveways	- Submit receipts for a payment request		
	- Maintenance must be provided for 10 years
