



Radon

What is it?



Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that cannot be seen, smelled, or tasted

Why is it dangerous?



Radon is the **2nd** leading cause of lung cancer

Radon attaches to dust or tobacco smoke and gets carried into the lungs

N∩ safe level of rador

Most exposure occurs in homes

What can you do about it?

TEST YOUR HOME KNOW YOUR LEVE

Ask a certified radon professional to fix high radon levels

The state radon program and some local health departments provide free radon test kits

Secondhand Smoke (SHS)

What is it?



SHS is a mixture of smoke exhaled by the smoker and smoke from the burning end of tobacco products

CIGARETTE SMOKE CONTAINS:

More than **7,000** chemicals

and **69** cause cancer

SHS is **EVERYWHERE** when smoking is allowed

Featured business of the month: Cordial Coffee & Curated Finds

This Downtown Edition features businesses from the Shop Cynthiana discount card.

Cordial is a downtown coffee and vintage shop owned by 25-year-old Cynthiana transplant, Lexi Anderson. Lexi moved to Kentucky from a small town near Traverse City, Michigan when she was 11, and always dreamed about owning a business. She specifically remembers drawing little cafe's and shops, naming them whatever the store was with her name in front of it. Fast forward some 10+ years later, and Cordial was born.

Lexi often gets asked where the name "Cordial" came from, and where the idea for mixing old things with coffee came from. The name came from Google, put simply. When trying to brainstorm a name, Lexi wanted a oneword name that encapsulated the atmosphere she aimed for her business to have: to be warm and friendly. When searching words that were synonymous the first word generated was cordial. It was unique and perfect. The idea for the business model came from her boyfriend, Isaac Dailey's, which was a routine weekend adventure in thrifting and antiquing. At the beginning of their ventures, they would always grab a latte to start their day. Always at a small, locally-owned ma & pop shop.



When deciding to open her

dream business, she decided to combine her two favorite things: old things, and coffee. Especially after working a few different barista positions, and even having a couple of trial and error online clothing shops, it seemed like a good fit. Cordial sells pre-loved items that are hand-curated by Lexi and Isaac, ranging from clothing, to housewares, accessories and more. Cordial also sells delicious fair trade certified coffee, real-fruit smoothies, bagels, and organic herbal teas!


