1 BAG PER HOUSEHOLD

February 16th - Cole Crops and Leafy Greens (broccoli, cabbage, lettuce, kale, etc.)

February 23rd - Roots, Tubers, and Bulbs (onion, beets, radish, carrots, etc.)

March 1st - Legumes (beans, peas, etc.)

March 8th - Solanaceous (tomatoes, peppers, eggplant)

March 15th - Cucurbits (cucumbers, zucchini, squash, etc.)

March 22nd - Cucurbits (watermelon, cantaloupe, pumpkins)

March 29th - Miscellaneous (okra, swish chard, corn, etc.)



- 4 teaspoons olive oil 1 chopped yellow onion 3 cloves garlic, minced 1 box (48 ounce) lowsodium chicken broth
- 6 red potatoes, diced 1/2 cup chopped carrot 4 cups shredded kale 1/2 pound cooked chicken breast, shredded
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

- 1. In a large saucepan, heat the olive oil over medium heat for 1 minute. Add chopped onion and garlic and **cook** uncovered for 5 minutes.
- 2. Add chicken broth, potatoes and carrot; cover and bring to a boil.
- 3. Reduce heat and simmer for 20 minutes.
- 4. Mix in the kale, chicken and black pepper. Cover and simmer for 15

minutes or until kale is tender.

Yield: 6, 11/2 cup servings.
