

Horticulture Tips for September

- ⇒ Trees and Shrubs can be planted now through November, but be sure to adequately water new plantings.
- \Rightarrow Seasonal loss of inner needles on conifers is normal this time of year, so don't be alarmed.
- \Rightarrow Perennials can be divided now. When replanting, be sure to water in thoroughly.
- \Rightarrow Reseed dead spots in the lawn as needed.
- ⇒ Begin fall seeding or sodding of cool-season grasses. Seedbeds should be raked, dethatched, or coreaerated, followed by fertilizing and seeding. Keep newly planted lawns moist, but not wet.
- \Rightarrow Do not mow newly planted lawns until they are 2-3 inches tall.
- \Rightarrow Clean up any fallen or spoiled fruit from trees.
- \Rightarrow Harvest any summer herbs and dry them for future use.
- \Rightarrow Finish planting any cool season crops for the fall garden.
- \Rightarrow Start to prepare houseplants for overwintering indoors.
- ⇒ Garden spiders may be more noticeable. Spiders are natural predators for many garden insect pests.
- ⇒ Now is a great time to do a soil test! Soil tests are free to Harrison County residents. Call or stop by the office for more information.

Apple Cranberry Waldorf Salad

1 cup chopped Granny Smith apple

1 cup chopped Red Delicious apple

1 cup diced celery

1 cup halved seedless green grapes

1 cup halved seedless red grapes

1½ cups dried cranberries

1. Combine chopped apples and diced celery and put in a medium sized bowl. Add grapes, cranberries, and walnuts to the mixture. Stir ingredients together.

2. In a separate bowl, add the yogurt, honey, and cinnamon. Stir together and pour over the fruit mixture. Cover and chill before serving. 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

8 ounces non-fat vanilla yogurt

2 tablespoons honey

1/4 teaspoon cinnamon

Yield: 8, 1 cup servings.
